When the pilot gave the order to jump we abandoned the ship. Some flak came through the left side hitting me about the eyes (above) and sprinkling bits about the face. I landed all right and at once several farmers took my chute, mae west, etc. They said I was near Wanne, Belgium and then went to the farm. THAKKAX There they washed the blood from my face. Then I IXXX left my boots and flying suit. The Germans were around so they told me to leave for the woods. Well I went to the woods and later a fellow brought me to another house where I got some peasants clothes, and we buried my uniform.

A lady brought me into Brussels on the train. When we arrived at her house she said a friend of the hers had THEN taken two of my fellows a little earlier in Brussels but that the Germans had taken them.

I was taken to the farm of Charlier Rene, near Waure, Belgium where I had my face washed from blood.

XXXX

From this ladies house I moved about several days until I came to 18 Rue de Cult, Bruxelles when I met a Dr. Kharkofs I then moved to his **MAK*X** home for three weeks at 106 Rue de Laeken, Bruxelles. Then a Mons. George Auguier, 115 Boulevard Brand, Whitlock Bruxelles, brought me to Anderlecht, Bruxelles at the home of Mr. Gaston Lyned, 434 Chausee de Mones. There I met a co-pilot William **Kosseff who is with me at present. We remained in a room next door to Mons Lyneel who had given this house to the Red Cross and kept coffins there for use in bombardments. Consequently it was fairly safe. Mons. Auguier and Mons Lyneel are well known in the "White Brigade". We also met a Mons Tromme, Rue de Erasmus.

While we were at the Lyneel home he received a letter saying if he did not give 20,000 francs to a Miss Marie Therese Hurts, Stackel, Belgium they would denounce him to the Germans for x having Americans at his home. How anyone found out that we were there is a bit of a mystery, but the fellows in the White Brigarde believe that somewhere in the white brigade information leaked out.

Director, Bureau of Public Relations.

- 1. Publication or communication to any unauthorized persons of experiences of escape or evasion from enemy-occupied territory, internment in aneutral country, or release from internment not only FURNISHES USEFUL INFORMATION TO THE ENEMY but also JEOPARDIZES FUTURE ESCAPES, EVASIONS AND RELEASES.
- 2. Personnel will not, unless authorized by the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, War Department General Staff, publish in any form whatever or communicate either directly, or indirectly, to the press, radio or an unauthorized person any account of escape or evasion of capture from enemy or enemy-occupied territory, or internment in a neutral country either before or after repatriation. They will be held strictly responsible for all statements contained in communications to friends which may subsequently be published in the press or otherwise.
- 3. Evaders.escapees, or internees shall not be interrogated on the circumstances of their experiences in escape, evasion or internment except by the agency designated by the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, War Department General Staff, or the corresponding organization in overseas theaters of operations. In allied or neutral countries, American Military Attaches are authorized to interrogate on escape, evasion and internment matters.
- 4. Should the services of escaped prisoners of war, evaders, or internees be deemed necessary for lecturing and briefing, such services will be under the direct supervision of the agency designated by the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, War Department General Staff, or the corresponding organization in overseas theaters of operations.
- 5. Commanding Officers will be responsible for instructing all evaders, escapees, and internees in the provisions of this directive which supersedes letter, AG 383.6 (5 Nov 42) OB-S-B-M, 7 November 1942, subject: Instructions concerning Publicity in Connection with Escaped Prisoners of War and other previous instructions on this subject.
